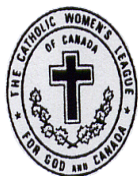
WINBOURNE PARK

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Joshua 24:1-2a,15-17,18b
We will serve the Lord, for he is our God.

Second Reading: Ephesians 4:32-5.2, 21-32
*This is a great mystery,
and I am applying it to Christ and the
church.*

Gospel: John 6:53, 60-69
*Lord, to whom can we go? You have the
words of eternal life.*

We hear of another turning point—
this time, in the ministry of Jesus. His
teaching on the bread of life has
alienated many of his disciples. “This
saying is hard; who can accept it?”
they ask (John 6:60). Jesus tells them
that acceptance of this statement is a
matter of grace. Jesus asks the Twelve
whether they, too, wish to leave him.
Peter speaks up, as Joshua did, with a
profession of faith. He does not say he
understands the teaching any more
than the others, but he knows that this
is where he belongs. There are other
teachers, but only one has the “words
of eternal life” (6:68).
