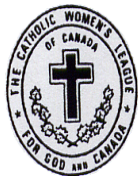

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary

Time

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:4-8

*Elijah went in the strength of that food to the
mountain of God.*

Second Reading: Ephesians 4:30-5.2

Live in love, as Christ loved us.

Gospel: John 6:41-51

*I am the living bread that came down from
heaven.*

The Gospel carries us deeper into the Bread of Life discourse. We begin to see that the new bread from heaven is at the very heart of the mystery. No one can come to Jesus, the bread of life, unless God the Father first draws him. To Jesus' listeners, familiar with stories of God feeding his chosen ones, the idea of bread from heaven was familiar—even comfortable. But at the end of the reading, Jesus says, “the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world” (John 6:51), which may have made them uncomfortable. In the readings for the next two Sundays we will ask the same question that the people of Capernaum ask: *How can this man give us his flesh to eat?*
